MACLAS 2024: Hemispheric Horizons: Publics, Power, and Place in the Americas Colgate University March 15 and 16 2024

Join us for the upcoming MACLAS conference at Colgate University (https://www.colgate.edu/) on March 15 and 16, 2024. MACLAS' 24th conference will feature eleven panels, as well as numerous posters, a research panel, and a pedagogical workshop. Dr. Thomas Miller Klubock (Corcoran Department of History, University of Virginia) will present the Whitaker address, titled: "What is a River? The Environmental History of Water and Water Rights in Chile." Meals and music will be provided.

MACLAS Prize and Awards.

MACLAS offers several prizes and grants to members. Please email your manuscript or proposal to the prize committee chairperson before the deadline. You can apply for different awards, yet each member can submit only one project per prize per year. Authors under consideration for the Street Prize cannot submit for the Davis Prize.

The Harold Eugene Davis Prize: The Davis Prize is awarded each year for the best book chapter or article published in the previous two years by a member in good standing for the past two years. The next deadline is February 2, 2024: Committee chair: Brian Potter (potter@tcnj.edu).

The Juan Espadas Prize. The Juan Espadas Prize is given for the best paper submitted to the MACLAS conference by an undergraduate student. The next deadline is March 30, 2024 for papers or posters presented at the 2024 conference: Committee chair: Jason Bartles (JBartles@wcupa.edu).

The Władysław Maryan Froelich Research Grant. The Władysław Maryan Froelich Research Grant enables recipients to access special research materials. Applicants should include a brief description of their project, methodology, and budget. The proposal should be around 2 single-spaced pages. The next deadline is February 2, 2024: Committee chair: Mirna Trauger (mirnatrauger@muhlenberg.edu).

The John D. Martz III Prize: The John D. Martz III Prize is given for the best graduate student paper presented at the last conference. The next

deadline is March 30, 2024 for papers or posters presented (continued) at the 2024 conference: Committee chair: Gonzalo Aguiar Malosetti (gonzalo aguiar @oswego edu).

The Judy McInnis Distinguished Service Award: The Judy McInnis Distinguished Service This award is granted in recognition of dedicated service to MACLAS. The next deadline is February 2, 2024: Committee chair: Gloria B. Clark (gbc3@psu.edu).

The James Street Prize: This prize is awarded to the author of the best peer-reviewed article published in MARLAS in the past two years. Do not submit manuscripts for this award. The MARLAS Editorial Board will nominate the top five articles to be considered by the James Street Prize committee.

The Christina Turner Graduate Student Travel Award: This award up to \$250 helps graduate students attend the annual conference. Graduate students attending the 2024 conference should send by February 2 a cover letter (with institution and degree program) and travel and lodging receipt(s) to: Amanda M. The Arthur P. Whitaker Prize: The Arthur P. Whitaker Prize is awarded for the best book published by a MACLAS member in the past two years. Authors must have been members of MACLAS for the previous two years in order to be eligible. The next deadline is February 2, 2024: Committee chair: Brian Potter (potter@tcnj.edu).



Call for submissions and editorial board members.

The editors of the Middle Atlantic Review of Latin American Studies invite MACLAS members to submit articles, essays, and research notes from all disciplines and topics related to Latin American Studies for review and potential publication. MARLAS is a peer-reviewed, online, diamond-level open access scholarly journal that is housed on LASA's Latin American Research Commons and is in its seventh year of publication, having taken over from MACLAS's print journal *Latin American Essays*, in publication since 1987. MARLAS is indexed in a range of leading indexes including EBSCO, Scopus, DOAJ, MLA, Google Scholar, HAPI, and more. We look forward to receiving your submissions!

The editorial board of MARLAS invites expressions of interest from scholars of Latin American studies in the humanities, arts, literature, social sciences, and history who are interested in joining the editorial board. This is a wonderful opportunity for MACLAS members to get involved and to play a key role in the editorial process as we curate and publish interdisciplinary, cutting-edge research in Latin American studies. Editorial board members are expected to periodically review article submissions, and to attend two board meetings per year, one at the annual conference and one virtual meeting in the Fall. They also advise the lead editors on questions of policy and strategic direction for the journal. Those interested in joining the editorial board should send their CV and a brief paragraph explaining their interest and experience to Jeff Pugh at jeffrey.pugh@umb.edu.

MACLAS Leadership Opportunities.

The editor of the AI Commentaries Section is Dr. Meghan McInnis-Domínguez, University of Delaware, MARLAS Editorial Board member, and author of the essay in MARLAS 7.2 (December 2023) on an experiment: "An AI Solution: Using ChatGPT to Counter Plagiarism and Boost Enrollments in Hispanic Literature Courses." The essay provides a brief overview of AI issues related to instruction at the university level.
